

Sheppey v Guy's Hospital (A)  
Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> November  
Result: 15-21

After fractitious coach journey Guy's arrived with 45mins to KO. A quick warm up meant the XV were ready for what was to be an extremely physical confrontation!!

The toss was lost by the skipper and Guy's found themselves playing into the low lying sun but took the offer to kick to Sheppey. The "Ditch" was in the best playing condition seen for many a year and perfectly suited for some GHRFC rugby. For the first 20 mins the game was played between the 22s and both sides missed relatively simple penalties to go ahead. The Sheppey defence tried to intimidate their younger and fresher counterparts but some great discipline and courage meant Guy's were able to maintain good ball and force some turnovers despite fists and boots flying left, right and centre.

The first score came when Sheppey managed to scrag the Guy's scrum half and force a turnover from a set scrum in the Guy's 22. But Rhys Davies stepped through and over the ruck to scoop up the loose ball (unseen by the author as he was at the bottom of the ruck with someone trying to break his arm). The ref awarded 2 penalties in quick succession on the Sheppey 10m line which the skipper was able to stick between the uprights. 15-16 and only a few minutes to go left the game well balanced but the momentum and fitness of GHRFC meant that their was really only going to be one winner. Another penalty awarded saw the kick go into the corner and recurrent penalties for collapsing the mall meant Guy's had another lineout on

the 5m line. The next mall however was driven in to touch but the Rhys “the eel” Davies stole the ball at the front of the line which the pack organised round and meant Rory “the sinus” went through to score 10m from the touchline. A missed conversion meant that there was only a 6 point difference. With only 2 mins left at this point in time Guy’s felt and knew that they were to be the winners but a penalty awarded in front of the posts on our 22 at the last play threatened to spoil the day. Some awesome D enforced a knock on and Guy’s ended up victorious.

A superb session in the bar with the 2 skippers initiating the others traditional post match ceremony saw the half back partnership of Pete Gretton and John Kendall receiving the gift of gin. A thoroughly good sing song saw renditions of ‘you can roll a silver dollar’, ‘I don’t want to join the army’ and a finale of ‘be kind to your web footed friend’ with an immediate exit saw Guy’s awarded winners on and off the pitch.
